



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Vowels are like animals...



Did you know that the five vowels are like animals? Well, they are! Every animal has a name... and every animal makes a sound:




(Parent/teacher note: The letter "Y" is also sometimes a vowel, but the letter "Y" doesn't follow the rule we are about to learn.)

Just like animals, each vowel has a name, and each vowel has a sound...




The <u>name</u> of the letter "a" is "a," and the <u>sound</u> of the letter "a" is ah, like in **Cat**.

I want you to say the name of each vowel, then say the sound that it makes.




If you add a little "e" to the end of a word.... well! The little "e" is very naughty – the little "e" reaches around and pinches the other vowel, making the vowel call out it's name.





The little "e" is silent, because it doesn't want to get in trouble.

Let's practice how the "silent e" changes vowels....






Jan and Jane like to sing,

And Jane sings, "Tweet, tweet, tweet."


Jane also flaps her little wings,

My mother makes me wear it.




I gave my brother, Dave,

When Dave also ate the plate.




I like to **take** my teddy bear To school with me.

I can **take** him when he's bigger – Right now he's much too small.




I asked my mom to make me A cat costume and a cape; I asked my mom to make me A lovely lemon cake.

I invited my best friends;

"Made" and "make" mean the same thing.
We say "made" when we talk about something we made in the past; we say "make" when we talk about making something now or in the future. Let's practice...




I like to play with Play-Doh (Plasticine);

And I made the cat a ball




Tomorrow, dear Mother,

I won't **make** a fuss –

Hiding in the **cave**.

Who will **Save** me

From that bear inside the **Cave**?

Oh – it's not a bear,

It is just my brother, **Dave**.

Although the word "have" looks like "Dave" and "brave," it sounds different. Let's practice...




I have a brother, Dave,

I also **have** a sister

Who is very, very nice,

But she is not as **brave** as **Dave** –

She is really scared of mice.



I have two dogs,
And I have a cat.

But the cat wants a rat.

My cat thinks it's silly
To **chase** a ball;
She would rather **chase** a rat
Or nothing at all.

The words "had" and "have" mean the same thing. We say "had" when we talk about the past; we say "have" when we talk about now or the future.

Tomorrow I will have

Does anybody want


A cheese sandwich for their lunch?

I have a bunny rabbit


Who wants to eat them, please?

Or can my bunny lick the plate?




When I had a cold,

The letter "C" has no sound of its own...



But sometimes, the letter "C" sounds like an "S" -



The letter "C" ALWAYS sounds
like an "S" when the "C" is followed
by a letter "e," "i" or "y"

I only had one cent.

Cindy likes to eat candy.


Some people spell their name "Cyndi" instead of "Cindy"



And the letter "C" ALWAYS sounds like an "S" when followed by a silent "C" -



My cat has a funny face.




When my brother is sad,


I make this silly face

When I make this silly face.





If you have green skin,

So he always knows the time –


Tim knows when the time is eight;

Tim knows when the time is nine.


Tim has a sister, Susan,

Would be in the water.




Remember – the "k" in "kn" is silent.




I like ice cream;

And so do my mice.


My mice like chocolate ice cream;

I took a breath and closed my eyes.


So I never did know

The day I took a ride


On an elephant.

Good to know: The letter "I" all by itself says it's name. That's why we say "I" when we read the letter "I."



I cannot tell a lie:
I am the one who ate the pie.
I swallowed the pie
In just one bite –
The pie was good,
The pie was yummy,
And now the pie
Is in my tummy.

Remember, the letter "y" at the end of little words, like "my" and "try," also sounds like "I" and "pie."



My brother cannot tie his tie,
So I try to tie it for him.
I try and try and try,
But his tie won't tie beneath his chin.

Should I say the dog ate the tie?
Would that be a good excuse?
Why should kids tie a tie
When they can't even tie a shoe?

Even though it looks like "drive" and "five," the word "give" breaks the rule and sounds different.



I want to **give** my brother A car when he turns **five**;
I want to **give** my brother A car so he can **drive**.

Then perhaps he'll **drive** me

To the park and to the zoo.

I can't **drive**, I'm much too young –


Hello, I'm only two.

The word "live" sometimes sounds like "give" and sometimes sounds like "five."




I live in a house

Then my fish could **live**On the mat over there.









I hope you can hop

Quick! Before they leave.




Never, ever **poke**A sleeping bumble bee;

Come in here all the time?


When you see the letters "W" together, remember that the "W" is silent.

Let's practice...



My teacher **Wrote** a **note**And sent it **home** with me.
My teacher **Wrote** a **note**And trusted it to me.

But the **note** is **not** in my hand;
It's **not** even in my pocket.
The **note** is **not** anywhere —
Oh dear, I think I lost it!




Yesterday, I **Wrote** a **note**To remind myself of something,

But I **Wrote** the **note** with invisible ink,

And now the **note** says nothing.

The words "Write" and "Wrote" mean the same thing. We say "Wrote" when we talk about something we Wrote in the past; we say "Write" when we talk about writing something now or in the future.




Before I can learn to **Write** my name, I must learn to **Write** my ABC.

Yesterday I **Wrote** the A,

Today I will **Write** the B;

Tomorrow I will **Write** the letter C –

Oh, clever, clever me!



I told my brother

Not to **Write** on the wall,

But he **Wrote** his name

In letters big and tall.

He said I never told him

Not to **Write** on the wall.


Then he said he couldn't hear me –

His ears are much too small.

Sometimes an "S" can sound like a "Z" – let's practice...



This medicine is gross,
It's hard to take a dose.
So I pinch my nose
And close my eyes
To take a daily dose.




When I was two I had a cold,

And my nose was as red as a rose.

The cold was so bad it was more than a cold – I think what I had was a **froze**.


The word "Close" can sound like a "Z" or an "S" depending on how you use it...



I stood with my **nose**So **close** to the door
That I could not **close** the door.

But then my brother
Slammed the door,
And my nose fell onto the floor.

The word "**goes**" sounds like "**nose**" but is spelled differently.




Everyone's **nose goes** beep beep;
The **nose** of a cow, the **nose** of a sheep.

I'll bet your **nose goes** beep, beep, beep –


Squeeze it and say, "beep, beep, beep."

The word "goes" means the same as "go" – sometimes we say "go," and sometimes we say "goes."



I **go** to sleep in pyjamas;
My cat **goes** to sleep wearing fur.
I **go** to school to learn how to read;
My cat **goes** to school to purr.
When I **go** outside, my cat comes too –
She **goes** everywhere I do.

A little word that ends with an "O" sounds the same as "Joe" and "toe."




No, Joe, I will not look
At your silly old toe
Or your silly old foot.

And **no**, **Joe**, I don't care

About the spoon on your **nose**Or the **hole** in your hair.

Remember, the word "do" looks like "go" and "no" but sounds different.



Do I like smelly cheese?

Yes I do - I'm a rat, if you please.

And I would go almost anywhere

For cheese so smelly


It would curl your hair.

The word "does" looks like "goes" but sounds different.

The word "does" means the same thing as "do" – sometimes we say "do," and sometimes we say "does."



Where does the river go?
The river goes to the sea.
I would like to go there too,
Do you want to go with me?



Do I like taking a bath?

Yes, I do – baths make me laugh.


But my dog does not like

Taking a bath. He runs away –

He does not laugh.

He **goes** under the house,
Where I can't **go**.
He **does** not come out;
He shakes his head, "**no**."

And remember, "to" and "you" also sound like "do."



What do you do
When a ghost goes, "boo"?
Do you run to your room;
Do you go, "boo, hoo"?

Or do you "boo" right back
At a silly old ghost?
Who is scared the most –
You or the ghost?

The word "Shoe" looks like "toe" but sounds different.



This **shoe** is much too small for me; It belongs to Baby **Joe**.
I don't think I can wear a **shoe**That only fits my **toe**.




My ice cream **CONE** tastes funny;
My ice cream **CONE** tastes weird –
They put mashed potato
By mistake in here.



I gave my dog a bone,
Which he buried in the ground.
When he went to dig it up,
The bone could not be found.

My doggy dug another hole,
Looking for that bone.
The bone is out there somewhere,
Sad and all alone.

The letters "p" and "h" together sound like "f" – like in "phone" and "photo."



My dog was very angry
When he couldn't find the **bone**,
So he called the **bone** police
On a special bone phone.


But nobody answered

The **bone** police's **phone** –

All the **bone** police

Were fast asleep at **home**.

The words "done,""one" and "none" look like "bone" and "phone" but sound different.




Oh dear, what have I done?

I ate a hundred donuts

When I should have eaten one.


Mama called the doctor on the **phone**,

And she ate One.


When we **Woke** this morning,

The words "COME" and "SOME" look like the word "home" but sound different.



I want my cat to **come home**And spend **some** time with me.
I want my cat to **come home**,
But he won't **come** down the tree.

My cat is not **done** sleeping
Up there in the tree;
He says he will **come** down
At a quarter after three.



I have **SOMe** money,

But not a lot.


Enough to buy **SOMe** ice cream And **SOMe** pizza nice and hot.

I would like to take the pizza

Home with me,


But my dog will eat the pizza,


I have some gum Come and see.
